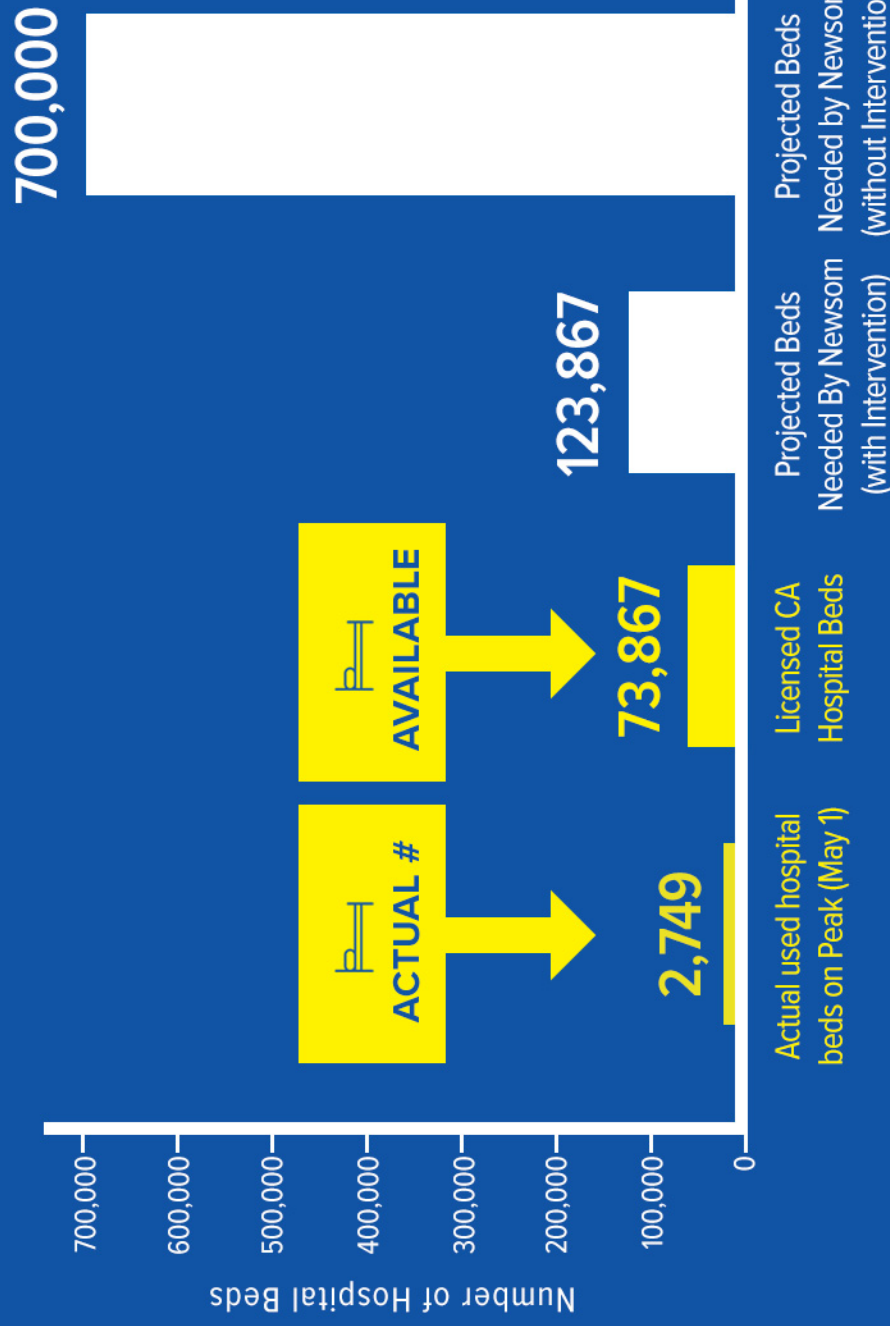


California's \$14 Billion Loss After Over Projection

CALIFORNIA'S MODEL FOR COVID19 OVER PROJECTED A SURGE IN HOSPITAL CENSUS



California "Stay at Home" orders were meant to prevent overwhelming hospitals.

A surge that never hit has led to widespread financial duress for hospitals with \$14 Billion revenue loss, healthcare workers lay-offs, furloughed workers, and pay cuts for physicians and staff.



Actual number of (licensed) ICU beds and ventilators were never at risk of reaching capacity.
