## 11 Key Facts about COVID-19, Kids and Kawasaki Disease

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Findings as of May 22, 2020

- In the largest study conducted by the United States on Covid-19 1.7% were among children aged <18 years.
- There have been 3 pediatric deaths in the United States associated with Covid-19, all are currently still being investigated. In contrast there have been 176 pediatric deaths from influenza in 2019/2020.
- Hospitalization is most common in children <1 and those with underlying medical conditions.

- A recent review of 72,314 cases by the Chinese Center for Disease Control and Prevention showed that less than 1% of cases were in children under the age of 10.
- 3 patients in this study required intensive care and breathing assistance. All 3 children had preexisting medical conditions.
- Children may not be super spreaders, but instead capable of building immunity with minimal symptoms of covid.
